R.E	Draw and reflect upon the Stations of the Cross.	Make a Holy Week Calendar using collage. (See resource folder for ideas)	Draw pictures and write captions for the Easter Story
Writing	Write an Easter Acrostic poem. Everyone is happy Alleluia S T E R	Write an application to become an assistant to the Easter Bunny. Why do you want the job? Why would you make a good assistant?	Write a set of instructions on setting up an Easter Egg Hunt.
Reading	Carry out the reading comprehension on 'How to Look After a Rabbit' in the resource folder.	Read as many books as you can find with rabbits, chicks and lambs in them.	Create a word jar to store all the new Spring words you can read decorate the words and share them with someone at home.
Maths	Print or copy 'Counting in 2s, 5s and 10s' and follow the instructions.	Play the 'Roll, Add, Colour' game in the resource folder.	Draw a large egg. First person decorates one side, second person must make it symmetrical.
