

Year 2

We're hoping that you are safe and doing well. We are missing seeing each and every one of you. Here are some fun activities to keep you busy this Easter.

Maths:

Each day, there is a short video and activities available with the answers provided.

- Learn your times tables - 2s, 5s and 10s are very important for Year 2. If you know these, start to learn your 3s, 4s and 8s times table.
- Bake something delicious: use a measuring jug or scales to check that you are using the correct amount. You could also work out what time your food would be done.
- Learn the time to the nearest 5 minutes. You could even create your own clock to help you tell the time.

English:

- Use the literacy shed to look at the video: 'The Clock Tower.' <https://www.literacyshed.com/the-clock-tower.html>

Day 1: Create a plan for the story, what is happening? What adjectives you would use throughout the story? Who is the main character? How are they feeling?

Day 2: Start writing the introduction for the story (stop video at 34 seconds). Try to use a range of sentence starters, adjectives and conjunctions.

Day 3: Continue writing the story: Think about the colour change, how the mood has changed? How the girl is moving?

Day 4: Finish the story: How is the girl feeling now? What can she see?

Day 5: Proof read and edit work: Does the written work make sense? Have you checked your spellings? Have you used a range of adjectives and adverbs? Are capital letters and full stops in the correct place?

We strongly recommend that you spilt the whole writing piece over a week at least, to ensure that the children are writing a high quality piece of text.

- Create your own monster. Think about the adjectives that you could use to describe it. Write a persuasive piece of writing why your monster is the best.
- Write us a letter and let us know what you've been up to. We'd love to hear all the things that you've been doing.
- Reading every day, really working on fluency and expression.

Other:

- There is an RE workbook uploaded on the school website; this will cover the RE until Pentecost.
- Go on a nature walk: What can you find? Are there any animals that you can see? If you go on the website www.schoolscience.co.uk/bughunt there is a Great Bug Hunt 2020 competition. A focus on mini-beast and their habitat
