

## Suggested home learning ideas for EYFS children in case of closure.

Here are some suggestions to help continue your child's learning at home. We'd love to see your work or photos of your activities when school is open again. Some of these activities are more appropriate for Reception children, however Nursery children may be interested with adult help.

How many of these activities can you complete?

Many of these activities can be completed more than once and repeated each day.

<b>Communication and Language</b>	Learn a tongue twister off by heart.**	Play Kim's Game.*	Play rhyming games.**
<b>Physical Development</b>	Master doing up your coat zip and shirt buttons. Can you do someone else's?	Try some yoga or practise your throwing and catching skills. **	Make some playdough and use it to exercise your hand muscles. **
<b>Personal and Social</b>	Play a card game with your family.	Play a board game with your family.	Make and write a card for a friend from school.
<b>Literacy</b>	Practise writing your first and surname. Can you write your family's names?	Keep a diary of what you do every day.	Become a book reviewer and review a different story each day.
<b>Maths</b>	Practise adding, subtracting, halving, sharing and doubling with your teddies.	Help mum or dad with the cooking. Can you sort the ingredients they need?	Set up a "shop" at home and practise using 1ps and 2ps to buy items. What if something cost 3p?
<b>Understanding the world</b>	Make a list of all the bugs and mini beasts you can think of.	Research a mini beast of your choice and create a fact file. **	Look out of your window for signs of spring - what can you see?
<b>Expressive Arts and Design</b>	Paint a picture of a spring flower or mini beast.	Create a model out of junk materials.	Create a dance or song. Can you perform it for your family?

**RE** = Where is God? Encourage your child and other family members to acknowledge when something good or nice happens. Discuss how it made you feel. We can see God in each other and each other's actions.

\*Place some items on a tray and give your child some time to look at them. Place a cloth over the items. Can they remember what was there? What if you took one item away - can they work out which one you took?
