
This week in R.E we have been finishing our work on 'Easter to Pentecost' and how the Tyburn Martyrs are Pentecost people.

English

The children have been working hard to use lots of different descriptive language in their writing. After half term we will continue with describing different settings.

Maths

In Maths this week we have been learning about plotting and reading co-ordinates on a grid. Please see an example below:

Science

This week in Science we have finished our topic on 'Electricity' we have been recapping our learning on materials that are insulators and conductors of electricity. After half term we will be starting our new topics 'Materials', focusing on solids, liquids and gases.

- What happened when the Romans invaded Britain?
- How did life change in Britain after the Roman invasion?
- The Roman army: weapons, training, uniform.
