October - Month of Mary

Class worship during October will focus on our Lady and the Rosary. There will be many opportunities during class worship time for the children to find out more about Mary and how to pray a decade of the Rosary.

Black History Month

October is Black History Month. Natalie, our history co-ordinator, has planned lots of interesting activities focusing on important historical black men and women throughout history.

Free School Meals

If you are in receipt of certain benefits, you may be eligible to apply for free school meals for your child (Year 3 upwards). Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will all receive free school meals but again, if you receive certain benefits, the school will receive additional funds to support your child. You will need to apply on line through Hertfordshire County Council. For further information and advice, please contact the school office.

CAFOD

For many years now it is a tradition at St Anthony's that we raise money for CAFOD – 'Catholic Agency for Overseas Development'. This charity reaches out to people living in hard-to-reach places, in war zones and those who are discriminated against. This year CAFOD are encouraging us to 'Go Green' as they are raising money for their climate crisis appeal. On **Monday 11**th October we will be organising a non-uniform day. The children may wear something green to school instead. This may be as simple as green socks or a green hair band. We would ask for a donation of £1 (or more if you can spare it) to be handed into the special green collection box in their classroom on the morning of the 11th October.

COVID -19 Update

Local Outbreak

As mentioned in a previous newsletter, in addition to our Risk Assessment, the school also have a Management Plan in place which we use in the event of an outbreak and we can also seek support from the local Education Public Health team.

Thank you for continuing to be vigilant as we all continue to do all that we can to keep each other safe.

Common Symptoms

The main symptoms of COVID-19 are:

a high temperature

- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- · a loss or change to sense of smell or taste

What to do if you or your child has symptoms

If your child has any of the main symptoms of COVID-19, even if they're mild:

- Get a PCR test (test that is sent to a lab) as soon as possible: Get a PCR test to check for COVID-19 on GOV.UK
- 2. Your child should stay at home and not have visitors (self-isolate) until you get a negative test result they can only leave home to have the test. Check if you and anyone else your child lives with need to self-isolate.

Contact Tracing

If a child tests positive for COVID-19, NHS Test and Trace will now contact close contacts directly, replacing communications from the school. Please engage with NHS Test and Trace if they contact you about your child, you will not be contacted or advised by the school about what steps you need to take.

Secondary Admissions

Please note that the deadline for secondary school applications (current Year 6) is 31st October 2021.

Uniform Reminders

The children need to wear indoor plimsolls inside our school. This is essential for keeping carpeted and tiled areas free of outside dirt and mud. Our online uniform shop provides plimsolls for children if any parents are struggling to find a pair. Red socks are also part of our uniform requirement.

Weekly Updates and Information Evenings

The teachers continue to send out their weekly updates to all parents. These are essential reading as they contain information, reminders and pre-teaching help. I would like to thank all the parents who have attended the Class Information Evenings. The teachers have been really pleased to see such a positive response and interest. These evenings are designed to help you support your child with the learning that is taking place in school but also offers guidance of how you can help your child at home. There are still some more of these evenings scheduled – please see dates for diary below. It was also lovely to see parents attend our recent Welcome assemblies – I was delighted that poor weather and a lack of petrol did not discourage attendance!

Wellbeing

I hope you are all finding time to look after your own wellbeing. It is very important that we continue to remember the '5 Ways to Wellbeing'. Teachers are continuing to add little challenges each week to their weekly update to remind the children of the weekly focus.
