This is for safety reasons – thank you.

There have also been two new canopies built to improve our Early Years building. One new canopy has been installed at the front of the building and a new one at the back to improve the outside learning area for

Reception Lisbon. I would like to thank our governing body for ensuring that funding was in place and for arranging the works with our diocesan architects.

Attendance

As you will know from my previous newsletters, each month I report to you the most recent attendance figures across the school. This will start again in my October newsletter. If your child is absent from school please telephone each day to keep the school office informed. A daily return has to be given to the Department of Education; therefore we need to know the reasons why your child is absent. We will also continue to monitor lateness at the beginning and the end of the day. For your information we are in the process of finalising a 'Late Collection from School' policy. This policy will outline action that will be taken for parents who are late on more than one occasion to collect their child after school. Annual Questionnaire

Many thanks to all the parents/carers who took time to complete our annual questionnaire in the summer term. Children are also being given an opportunity to complete a 'pupil questionnaire'. The results of both questionnaires will be analysed, discussed by the Senior Management Team and results will be shared in the October newsletter.

Reminders of safety rules for all children

- Please can you remind your child that the trim trails are **not** to be used before or after school for safety reasons. Ball games are also a safety risk before and after school as people are arriving/leaving on to the playground.
- It is great to see children arriving at school on their bikes/scooters but please remind your child to
 dismount once they arrive at school and walk to the scooter/bike shelters. They should not scoot or
 cycle around playgrounds where they can knock into people waiting for school to start/end. Helmets
 should also be worn for both these methods of transport.
- Can I remind parents that earrings are **not** to be worn by children in school. We have noticed an
 increase in the younger children wearing hoops and studs in their ears. The children need to take
 earrings out of their ears for school and put them in again when they return home. This is something
 we feel very strongly about in school for health and safety reasons. Plasters over the earrings are
 also not acceptable.

Secondary Admissions

Please note that the deadline for secondary school applications (current Year 6) is 31st October 2022. St Michael's Catholic High School open evening is 21st September and St Joan of Arc Catholic School open evening is 6th October. I would encourage you to visit these two schools as we would love to see all our St Anthony's children continue their education in a Catholic secondary school. Many of our staff have personal experience of St Joan of Arc and St Michael's and would highly recommend both schools.

Break Time Healthy Snacks and allergy advice

Children in Year 3 - 6 are able to bring in a healthy snack for morning break time. This must be either pieces of fruit or vegetables. Free fruit and vegetables are provided each day for our Reception and KS 1 pupils. Please remember that we are a nut-free school and therefore do not send your child in with any snacks or lunchtime food which contain nuts. We would also remind you not to send your child in with glass bottles for a lunch time drink.
