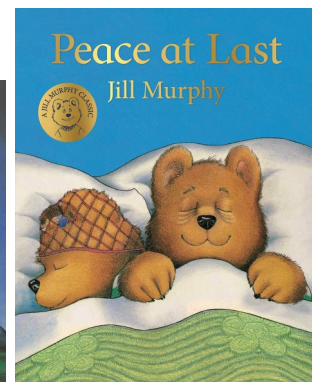
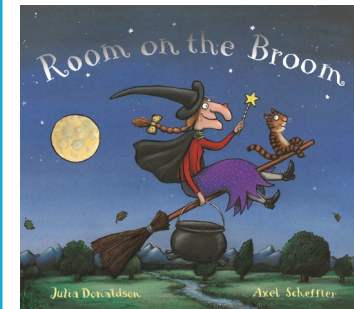
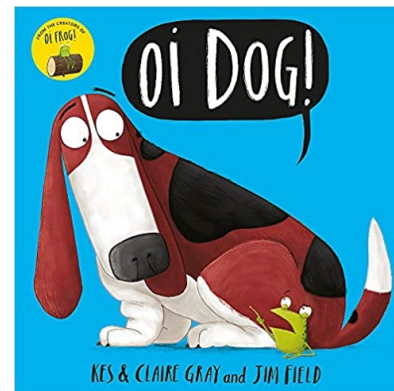
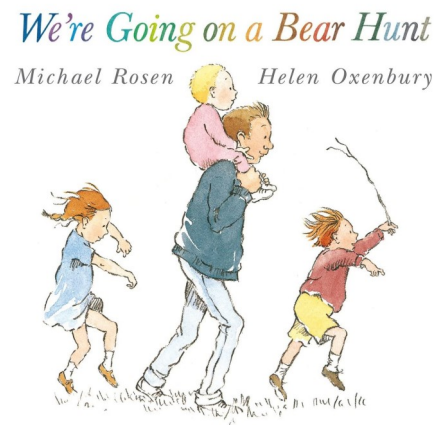
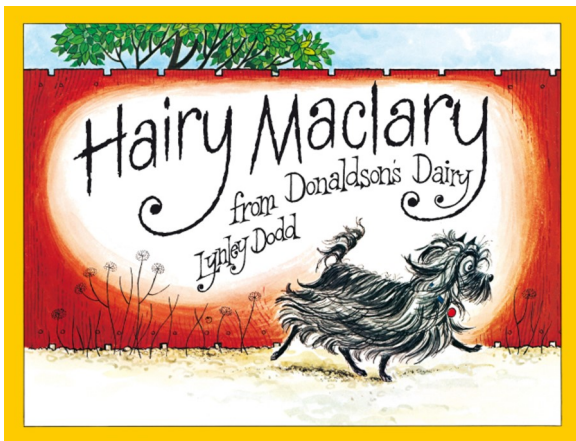
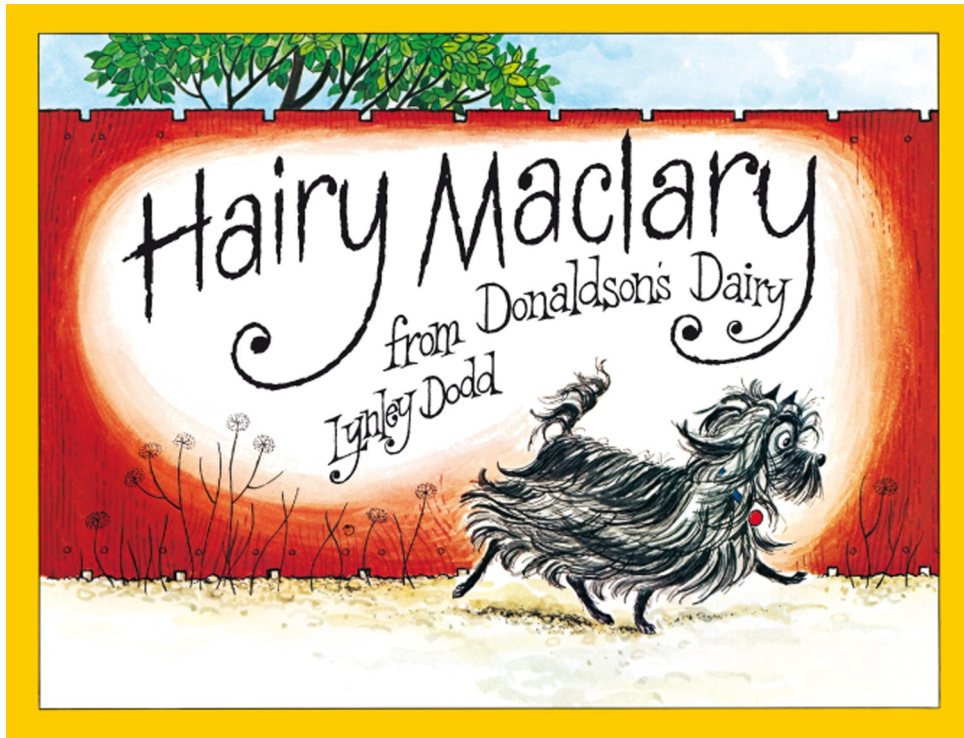


Autumn 2—Nursery's Must Read Books

We're Going on a Bear Hunt

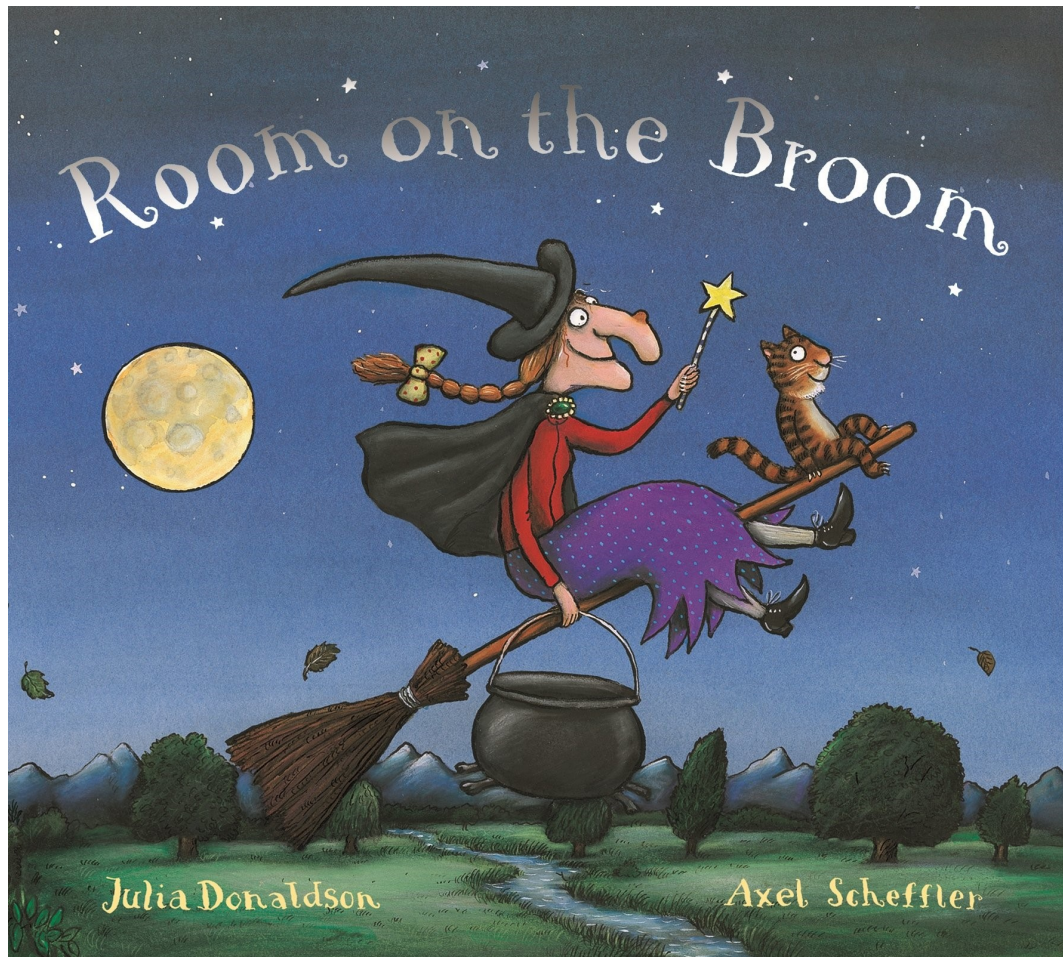

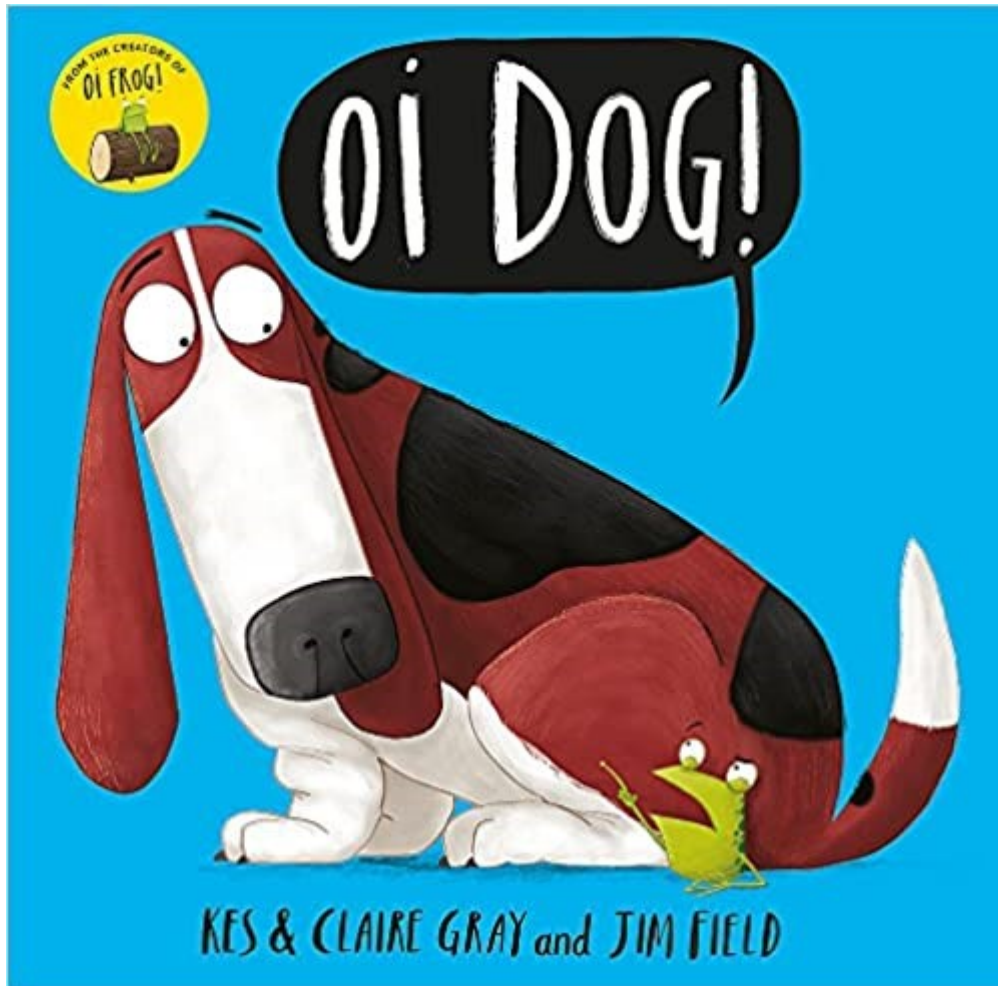
A sing-song story full of descriptive words, sounds and sensations.

E.g. "Yes" cried the witch and the dog clambered on, the witch tapped her broomstick and whoosh they were gone!

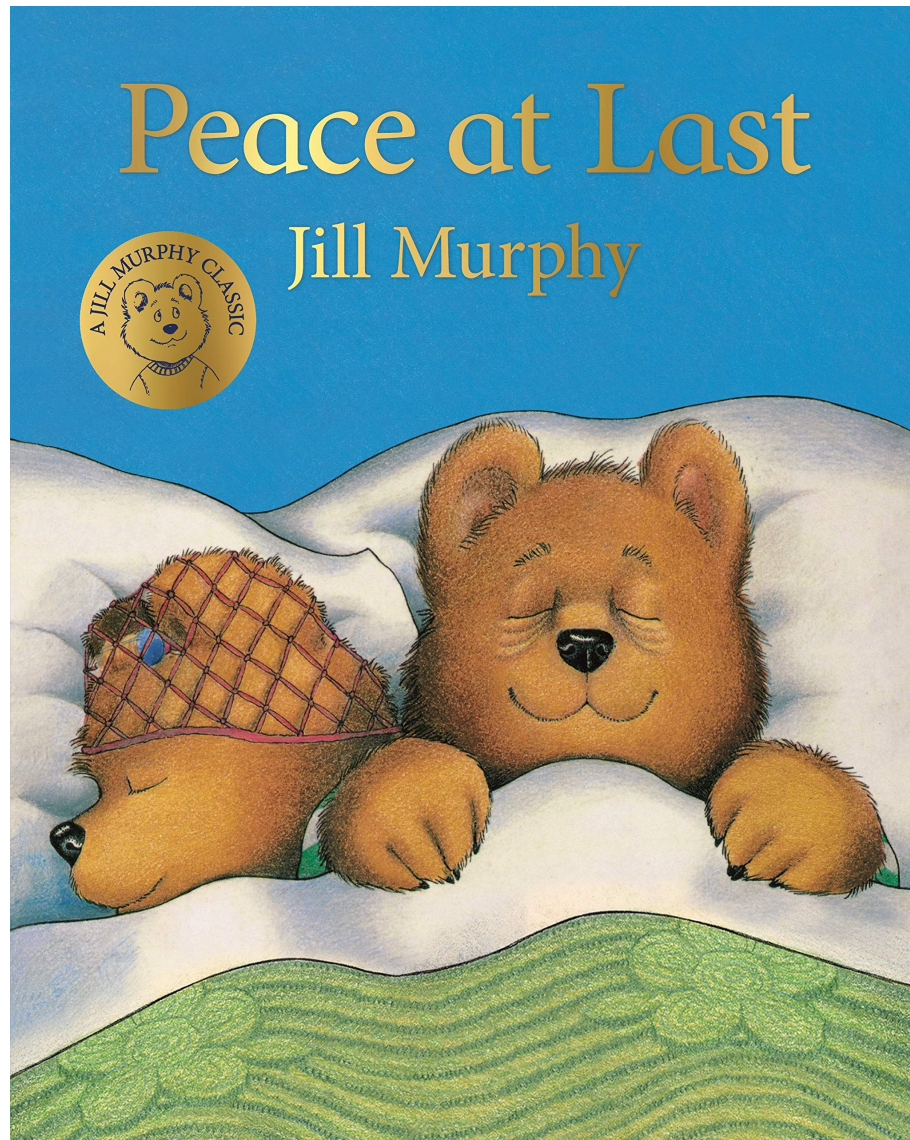


With help from the pictures the children can finish off each rhyming pair.
