# <u>RE</u>

In RE the children have restarted their learning for the topic Journey. They have been learning lots about the liturgical calendar. This week they have been looking at Ordinary Time. They have learnt why green is used during Ordinary Time and which gospels are read during this time (Year A-Matthew, Year B-Mark, Year C-Luke). They have learnt that the last Sunday of the liturgical year is celebrated as the feast of Christ the King. This feast day celebrates Jesus' power to set us free. It also reminds us about how we should serve other.

#### <u>English</u>

In English, the children have been introduced to the book *The True Story of the 3 Little Pigs* by Jon Scieszka and Lane Smith. They will be writing a news report about this incident, therefore they have been looking at how to summarise and identify key events by using the 5 Ws (who, what, where, when and why). They had a great lesson distinguishing between factual information and opinion. They understand that if something is a fact, it is known to be true. If something is an opinion, it is what someone believes. For example; 'Pizza is delicious' (opinion) and 'Pizza comes from Italy' (fact). The children have been practising how to apply coordinating and subordinating conjunctions in their sentences.

Their homework this week is Maths. This corresponds with this week's learning and should consolidate their knowledge.

#### <u>Messages</u>
