Year 5 Weekly Update - 20/1/2023

Both classes have had a busy week this week. We have continued with our move and learn sessions from Watford Football Club which have been enjoyable and interesting. We also had an assembly from Victoria Culf who will be leading the children in an Art project for the school.

RE

This week we have finished off our 'Mission' topic and have been beginning to look at Judaism. We have been focusing in particular on the Jewish festival of Passover. The children have listened to the song 'Let My People Go' by Paul Robeson and have considered how this relates to the story of the Exodus. They have also been looking at how Passover is celebrated.

Next week, will be starting a new topic of 'Memorial Sacrifice', we are asking if children could bring in an object or photo that evokes a memory for them. This will be for Monday's lesson (Lisbon) and Wednesday's lesson (Padua).

Vocabulary: remembering, Passover, seder, Pesach, kosher, Matzah, bitter herbs, Charoset, lamb, Shema, mezuzah

Maths

We have continued our Multiplication and Division topic by looking at using the method of long multiplication to multiply 4 digit numbers by 2 digit numbers. We are proud of how resilient the children have been with this. We have also begun to look at the method of short division and dividing 4 digit numbers by 2 digit numbers with remainders. Next week we will be consolidating these key methods.

Vocabulary: multiplying, formal method, regrouping, carrying, remainder, short division.

English

In our English lessons this week, we have read 10 chapters of our class book, 'The Boy in the Tower'. The children have enjoyed learning about the key characters and have been collecting clues and evidence like a reporter to predict what might happen in the story. They have been using these clues and their knowledge of the main character, Ade, to write from his perspective about these events. Next week, we will continue to work on this. If your child could borrow a copy from the library or a friend, it would be really helpful for their work and to read along in class.
