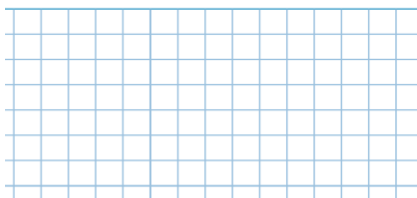
Maths Results



This week we have begun our topic of 'Memorial Sacrifice'. It was great to discuss so many of the children's memories and what they mean to them. Within this, we have also been recapping our knowledge of the Jewish feast of Passover and how this links to the Last Supper. We have been focusing on what the events of the Last Supper mean for Christians. Next week, we will be continuing this topic by looking at the Eucharist.

Vocabulary: memories, significant, Passover, Pesach, host, chalice, Liturgy of the Eucharist, Eucharistic Prayer, consecration, adoration, genuflect, acclamation

Maths

We have finished our Multiplication and Division topic this week by looking at how we can use these methods to solve word problems. We have also been recapping the methods of long multiplication and short division to ensure all children are confident with these vital skills. Next week, we will be looking again at Fractions, in particular multiplying and dividing fractions.

Vocabulary: multiplying, formal method, regrouping, carrying, remainder, short division.
