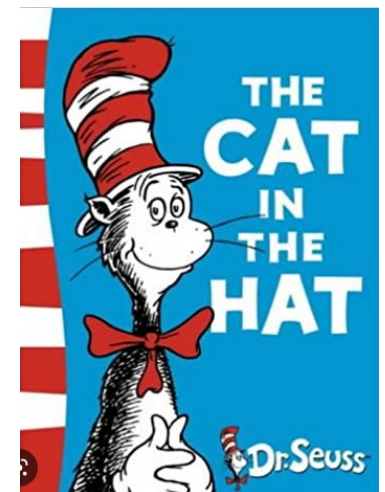
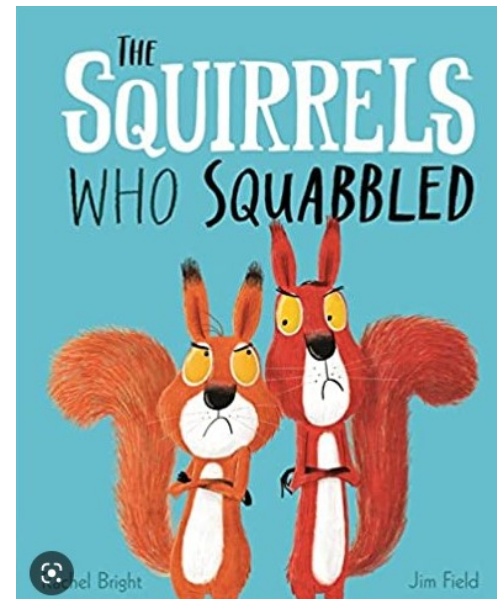
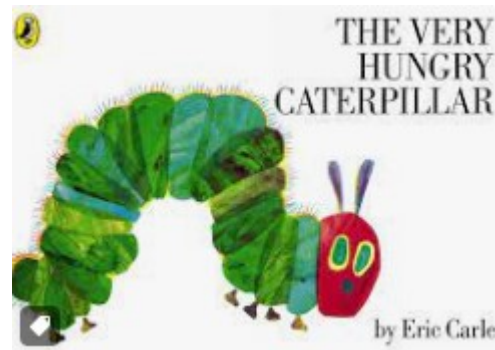
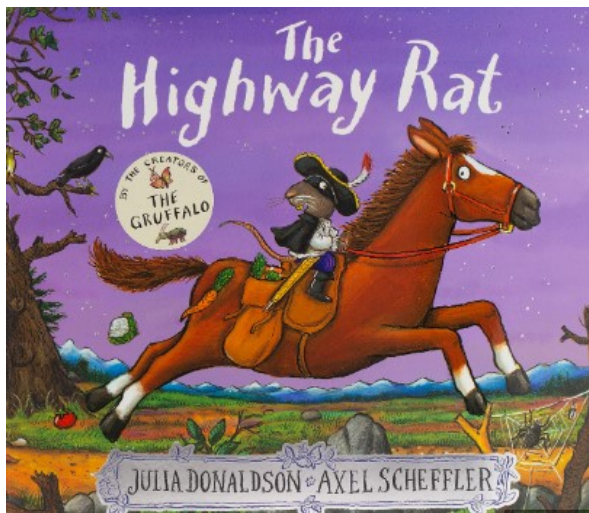
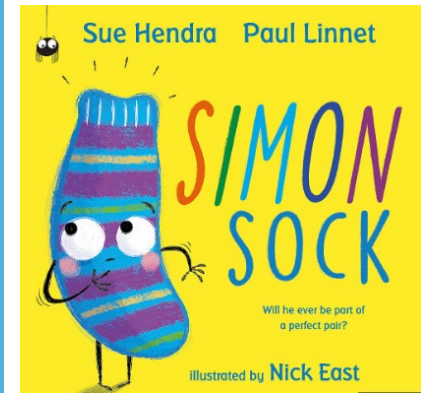
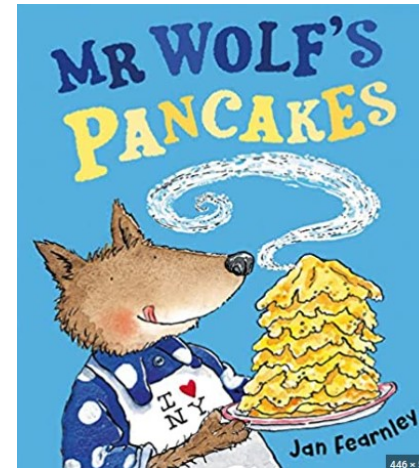


Spring Term 2—Must Read Books

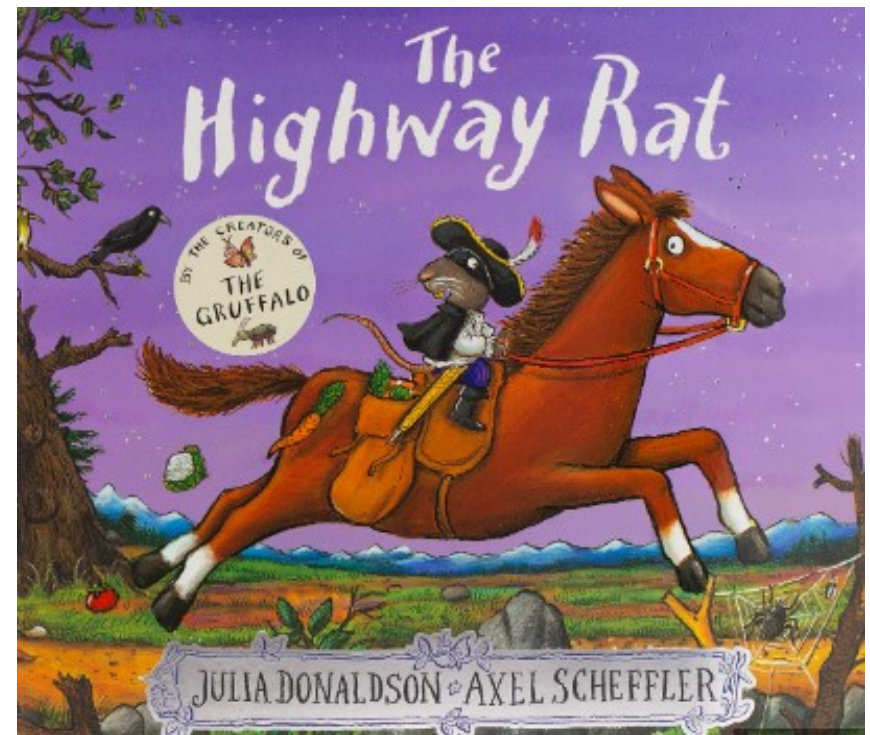

The Highway Rat

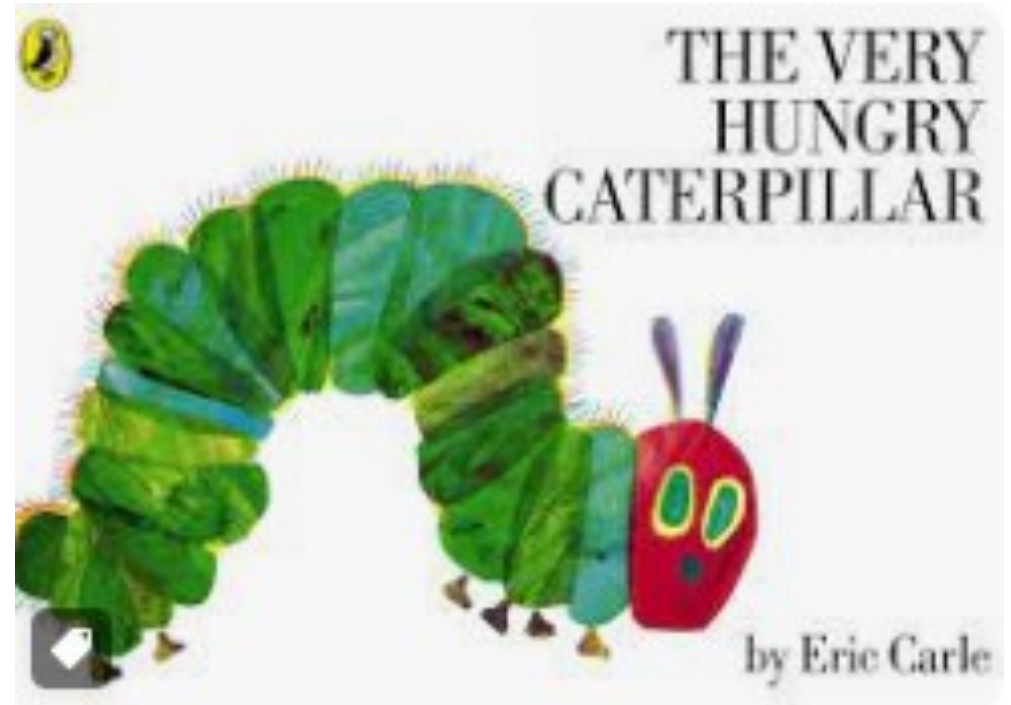

The Very Hungry Caterpillar

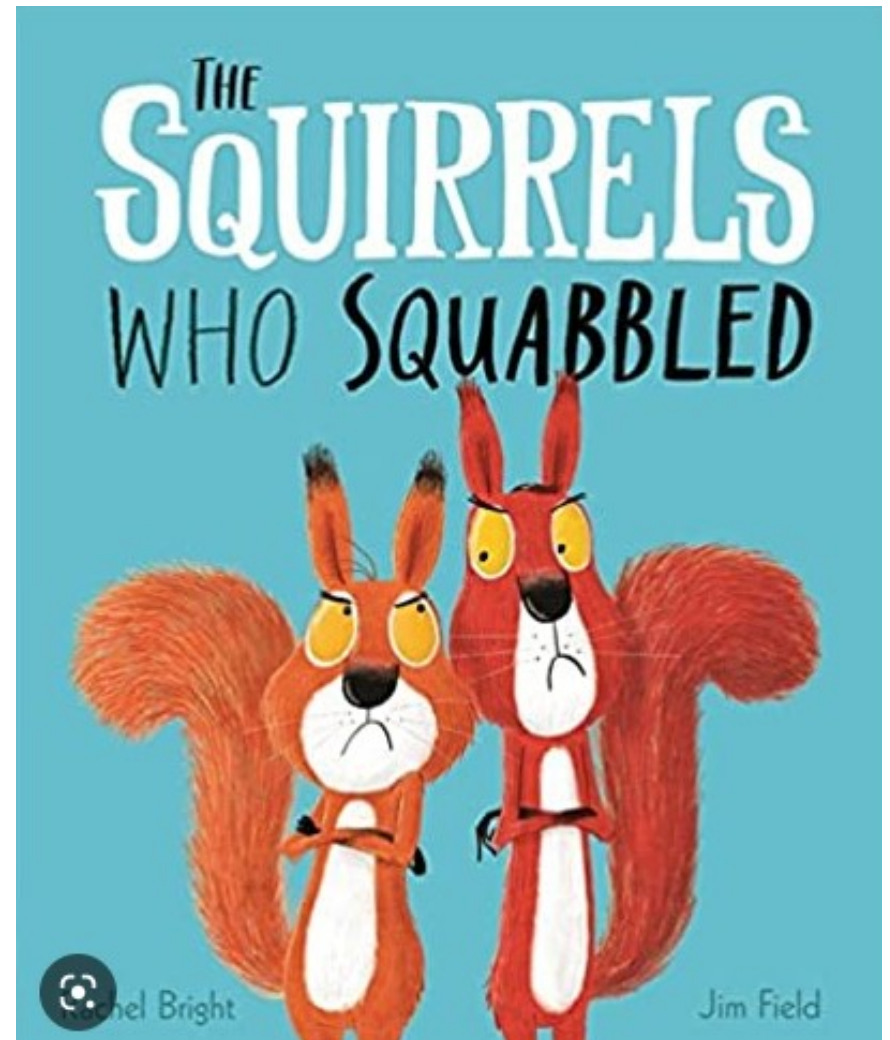
This classic children's book not only tells a wonderful story but also helps us to learn our days of the week, numbers, healthy and unhealthy foods and a butterfly's life cycle.

'The Squirrels who squabbled' is by the same author as 'The Lion Inside'.

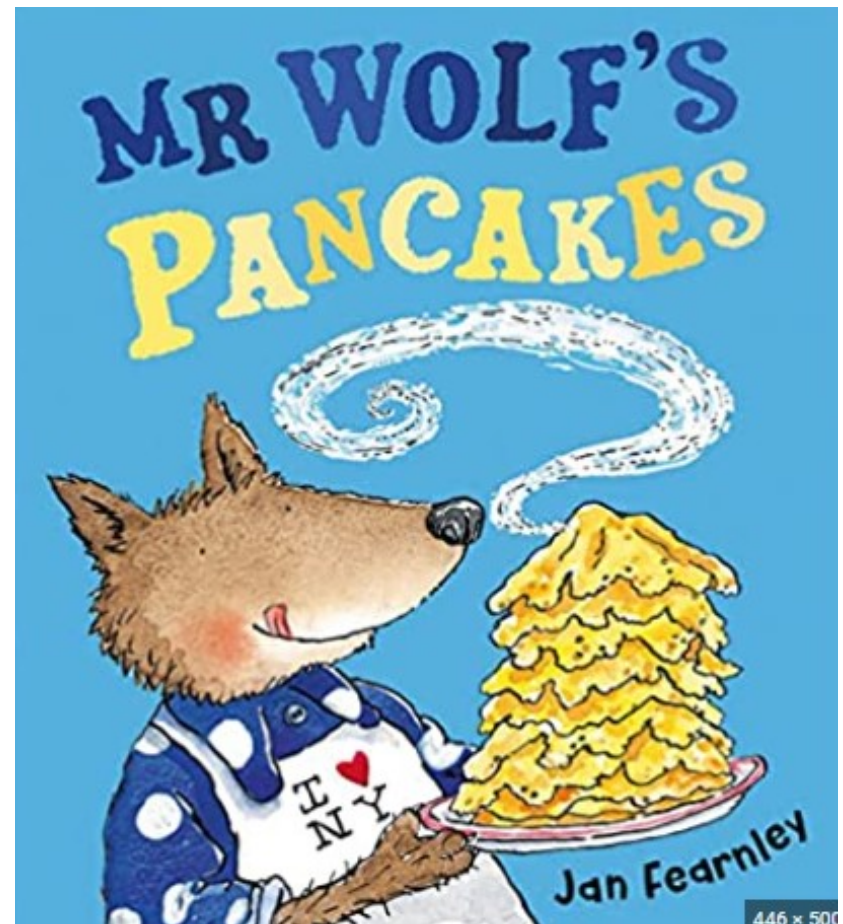
It teaches us about the importance of sharing through a funny story packed with rhyme.

'Mr Wolf's Pancakes' has a lot of repetition throughout so is a nice one for the children to begin to join in with and predict what comes next.

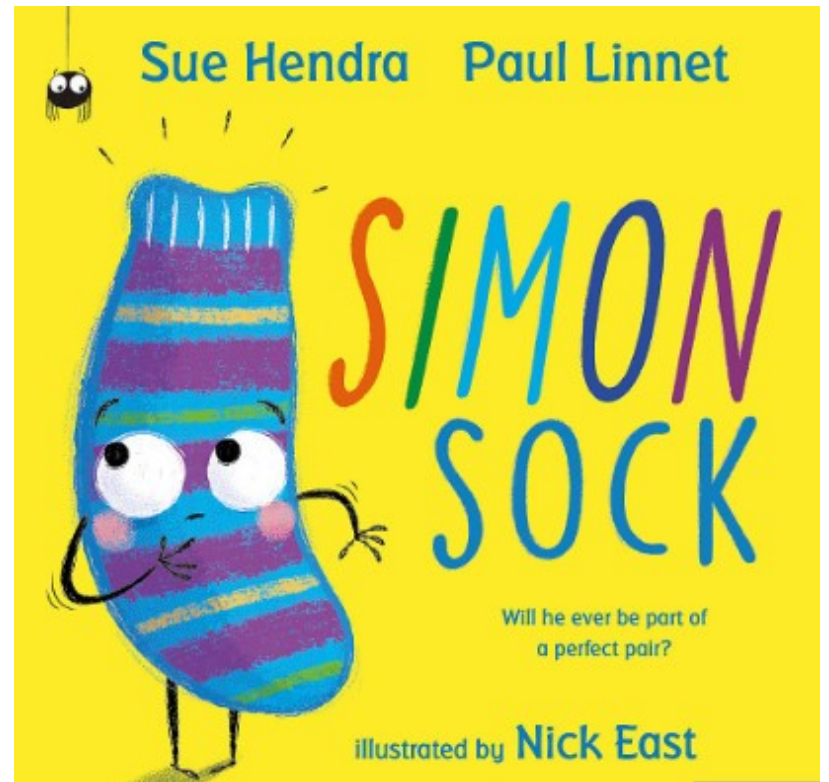
The ending however is a big surprise! Can you guess what Mr Wolf will eat?
