Year 6 Lisbon's Visit to Joan of Arc School

On Wednesday, the Year 6 Lisbon and Year 5 Lisbon classes visited St. Joan of Arc School. As part of our commitment to outdoor learning and healthy lifestyles, our staff walked with the children across Ebury Way to Joan of Arc. Deputy Headteacher, Mr. Lee, was our guide for the day. As with our previous visit, the children had a range of experiences starting with a period of reflection in the school chapel. They then participated in some music activities, before going to the drama department for some role-playing activities. After

lunch, the children did some science experiments with staff from the science department.

It was lovely to be guided around the school and greeted by many former pupils of St. Anthony's. We plan to have further activity days and sessions with St. Joan of Arc School in the future. We thank both staff and pupils for hosting us again.

Religious Education

This week we started our new topic which focuses on Lent and the road to Easter, **Death and New Life.** We looked at what our beliefs and values can teach us about loss.

Pre-learning

We will be looking in more detail at Lent and how it relates to Jesus' suffering and death.

English

This week the children started their mystery and suspense unit based on The Night of the Gargoyles which is an atmospheric storybook about gargoyles coming to life at night. The children had the opportunity to write a descriptive account from the point to view of someone witnessing these stone creatures coming to life using powerful word choices in order to create mood and atmosphere.

Vocabulary: atmosphere, mood, authorial choices, adjectives

Pre-learning

Next week the children will be describing the gargoyles and creating impressions of them by modifying nouns.

Mathematics

So much of our work is now revision so we looked at topics we covered last term. This week we looked at fractions and percentages.

Vocabulary: denominator, numerator, 10%, connection, percentage, division.

Pre-learning

We will continue to revise different topics next week including, long division and fractions.

Humanities

In Geography this week we have discussed what we can do to help with global warming. We have used the children's homework from last week to think about what is happening around the world and what we could do as a school to help.

We will be moving onto our History topic which is all about Crime and Punishment and how it has changed over the last 1000 years.

Next week we will be doing activities for Neurodiversity Celebration Week.

This is a worldwide initiative that challenges stereotypes and misconceptions about neurological differences.
