School Games Gold Mark Award

We are delighted to announce that we have achieved the School Games Gold Mark Award for the 2022/23 academic year. The School Games Mark is a Government-led award scheme launched in 2012, facilitated by the Youth Sport Trust to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community, and we are delighted to have been recognised for our success. Many of our pupils competed in local inter-school competitions last year and we are extremely proud of them for their dedication to all aspects of school sport. As part of our application, we were asked to fulfil criteria in

RAAC

You may have seen recent media coverage regarding Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC) and its use in educational settings. RAAC is a lightweight form of concrete; because it is weaker than regular concrete, concerns have been raised about its long-term durability. Department for Education (DfE) has recently changed its guidance to education settings on the management of RAAC to take a more precautionary approach and as a result areas in affected spaces will be vacated.

We wanted to inform you that we are not affected by this decision as we do not have RAAC in any of our buildings and therefore they will continue to function as normal. We understand that parents may want to understand more about the support to educational settings to manage RAAC safely. You can read more through the article published by the DfE on the Education Hub.

Watford Food Bank

Trainee Educational Mental Health Practitioner

We are delighted to have support from our local Mental Health Support Team, with Sam Marriott on site each Wednesday to offer a range of support with any concerns regarding mental health. Please see her introduction below which was initially shared with parents in July:

My name is Sam Marriott, and I am a trainee Education Mental Health Practitioner (or EMHP) working with the Watford Mental Health Support Team.

I will be based at St Anthony's every Wednesday from September.

My role at school will involve a few different things - all aimed at working to support children, families and staff with their mental health and wellbeing.

It will include working with parents/carers (using guided self-help) to support them in addressing behaviour or anxiety issues that their child might be experiencing.

I will also be able to provide workshops to pupils, staff, and parents around a mix of issues that may impact on wellbeing, and which might be helpful to the school community.

I am looking forward to working with you and your children!
