

R.E: This week we have carried out assessments on the work we have recently covered. The children have been recapping on the important symbols in Baptism and thinking about the important people in Jesus' life and comparing his life with their own.

Next week we will be learning about Judaism.

Key vocabulary: Stories, Abraham, Moses, leaders, Jewish, desert, promised, Pharaoh

English: This week we have talked about carrying out instructions and their importance. The children have learnt how to write instructions for making a jam sandwich.

We will be continuing working on instruction writing next week.

Please use the words first, next, then and finally over the weekend to familiarise your child with the language we will be using next week.

Key vocabulary: Full stop, capital letter, finger spaces, instructions, first, then, next, finally

Maths: This week we have been revisiting work we did last half term and the children completed an assessment based on their previous learning.

Next week we will be continuing with addition and subtraction activities.

Key vocabulary: part whole model, part, whole, addition, add, plus, equals, take away, minus, subtract, total

Science: This week we started our new topic 'Projects and Scientists'. The children learnt about what a fossil is and why they are important. We have looked at a variety of fossil examples.

Next week we will be learning about ammonites.

Key vocabulary: Fossil, ammonite, paleontologist, dinosaurs, prehistoric, markings, stone

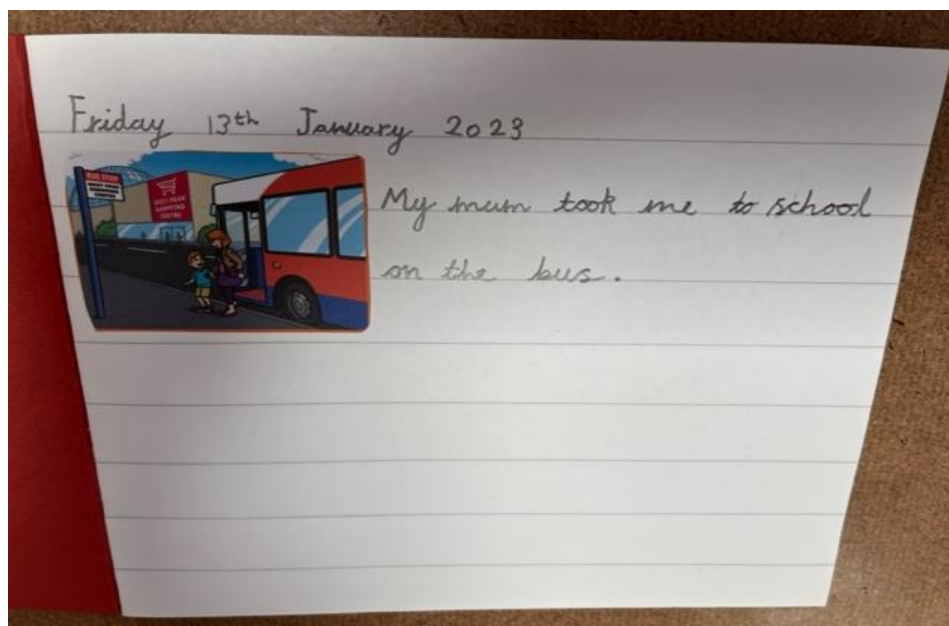
Extra information:
