Year 3 Update: 15th December

In RE this week the children have been finding out about more of Jesus' descendants from the Jesse Tree. They have been adding their own symbol each day to their class Jesse Tree and reflecting on how that person's story can impact our lives and inspire us today. They have also thought more deeply about the story of the Nativity from the perspective of the shepherds.

In maths this week the children have continued their work on addition and subtraction. They have learnt about complements to 100 (e.g 45 and 55, 24 and 76) and the importance of using the inverse operation to check calculations. After the Christmas holidays we will begin a new unit on multiplication and division. In order to prepare for this, we have set up a 'Battle of the Bands' between the two year 3 classes on TTRockstars. We will start by focussing on the 3,4 and 8 times tables when we return to school. Key vocabulary: complement, inverse, total, sum, difference.

In English this week we have completed our diary entry, writing as the dragon. The children came up with great ideas as to why the dragon did what he did! Our work this week highlighted the importance of knowing how to write in the past tense. There are many irregular verbs that the children found difficult to change into the past tense.
