RE

During our RE lessons this week, the children have begun thinking about the preparation time before Christmas. We have discussed what changes during Advent in our schools and churches and the importance of waiting in hope. We have been learning about what the prophets, Isaiah and Jeremiah, said about the Messiah and how he was described. We have used these words to create our class Advent calendar and each day we will turn over a new word to help us remember why Jesus is so special.


Vocabulary: hope, advent, Messiah, waiting, promised one



Maths

During their maths lessons this week, the children have been learning about equivalent fractions. This means that 2 fractions can look different from each other, but still represent the same amount. For example: 1/2 is the same as 2/4.

They have been learning different methods to find equivalent fractions. Please see below for the methods we have been using. This will be what their maths homework is based on this week.



$$\frac{18}{36} = \frac{6}{12} = \frac{1}{2}$$

$$\div 3 \quad \div 6$$

Vocabulary: Equivalent fraction, unit fraction, non-unit fraction, multiply, divide

Get ahead: Next week we will begin to learn about converting improper fractions to mixed numbers.

English

We have been continuing our work on Legends this week and have been focusing on 'Fionn and the Salmon of Knowledge'. The children have been making predictions and inferences about the story from the front cover. They then took inspiration from the story to design their own mythical creature and write a descriptive piece based on this.

Vocabulary: legend, Celtic, Infer, Prediction, Description, Parenthesis

Get Ahead: Research a legend from a different culture. Can you use any ideas from the story in your writing for next week?

Science

Over the last two weeks we have been looking at reversible and irreversible changes. The children have been identifying different changes that are reversible and how they can be reversed, as well as irreversible changes and why they are irreversible.

Key Vocabulary: Mixture, evaporation, filtering, sieving, Reversible change, Irreversible change.


Geography
