RE Inspection – Section 48 Report

We were delighted to receive the recent RE Inspection report. This has now been sent to all parents with a letter from our Chair of Governors. I would like to thank our fantastic children whose behaviour was described as 'exemplary' and also thank our dedicated staff team and governors who work so hard. A huge thank you to the parents/carers who spoke so highly of the school to the inspectors and whose words made up much of the report – thank you so much !

We are very pleased that the inspectors enjoyed the time they spent in our school and decided that we should receive an Outstanding grade in all areas inspected. Below are the words taken from a letter we received from the **Chief Inspector of Schools – Nancy Conoboy:**

Having accompanied the inspection team, I can see that the report has really captured what it is like to be a member of your school community.
