Year 3 Update 26.1.24

RE

In RE the children have continued their learning for the topic 'Journey' where they have been learning about the liturgical calendar. This week they have been looking at the important feast days set aside in the Liturgical Year to remember and celebrate the journey of Mary and how the Rosary is especially powerful in strengthening our relationship with the Lord.

Vocabulary- liturgical, rosary, sacred, meditate, luminous, glorious, sorrowful.

English

In English, we have continued with our work around The True Story of the 3 Little Pigs. We learnt how to use prepositions to describe a scene which the children completed as if they were a reporter describing the events that took place. We have also started planning our news reports and we will be writing our news reports next week.

Vocabulary- prepositions, eyewitness account, headline, alliteration, paragraphs

Maths

In maths this week we have been continuing our work on multiplication. We have continued learning how to partition a number to multiply (2-digits X 1-digit). We have also looked at how to multiply and divide a two and one digit number using the formal method with and without exchanging.

<u>Vocabulary</u>: related calculation, multiply, digits, partition, formal.

Science

In Science, the children worked in groups to make their own protective structure for the egg drop challenge and we carried out the experiment in the playground. The children had a fantastic time working together and finding out how well their structure worked at slowing down the gravitational pull on the egg so that it would not crack on impact. They then evaluated their design, considering what went well and how they may improve their design next time. Next week, we will be exploring density.

<u>Vocabulary-</u> Gravity, protective, force, prediction, fair test, variable, gravitational force, minimise, transfer

The English homework this week links to this week's spellings where they are learning about homophones. We would like you child to write these words in a sentence, so they are aware of the meaning of these words and how to spell them in the correct context.
