In RE the children have started their learning for our new topic called Journeys. We thought about the key events that take place every year and the different seasons and how they impact our journey throughout the year. The children focused on their own year and considered the highlights of their year and any difficult times they may have experienced and strategies they can use to help with this. They also began to learn about the liturgical calendar and how it helps Christians to be close to the work of the Trinity, God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit and that throughout the seasons of the year it brings the Church family together. We will continue to learn more about the liturgical year next week.

Vocabulary: Ordinary time, Paschal triduum, Gospels, Scripture


English

In English, we started our new text called 'The True Story of the Three Little Pigs'. The focus of this text will enable the children to write their own newspaper articles, including the key features. This week, we focused on summarising a news article, the children had to read it carefully and find the key information, making sure they answered the key questions, what happened, when did it happen, where did it happen, why did it happen and who was there. They also identified the key features of news articles too. Next week, we will distinguish between key events and additional information and between factual information and opinion.

Vocabulary: Headline, reporter, features, article, journalist, events, paragraph, headline, eyewitness

Maths

In Maths the children have started their new topic where we will focus on the different strategies we can use to help us multiply and divide numbers. This week the children revisited multiples of ten and the patterns they notice. We also looked at related calculations. Please see examples of this below.



Vocabulary: multiplication, division, array, repeated addition, equal groups, altogether


Science
