

R.E: This week in RE we read the story of The Last Supper based on Luke 22: 19-20. This was the Last Supper Jesus had with his disciples before he died. After Jesus died, his friends would meet together and celebrate as he had asked them to.

Today, people still celebrate this special meal when they gather for Mass. The priest repeats the words Jesus said at the Last Supper; *"This is my body and this is my blood."*

This is Jesus giving himself to us.

The children thought about when a special meal happens at Mass and who says these words at mass. Ask your child what Jesus said and who now says these words at Mass.

- Q Why was this called the Last Supper?
- Q What did Jesus do and say?
- Q What food and drink did Jesus and his friends share?
- Q What did Jesus ask people to do?
- Q During Mass who does what Jesus did at the Last Supper?

- Next week we will learn about what happens when we prepare the gifts at Mass and compose a litany of thanks for all God's gifts using the response, 'Blessed be God forever'.

Key vocabulary: family, share, meal, bread, host, wine, gift, meal, family, Holy Communion, Last Supper, Mass, blessing, Preparation of the Gifts, litany, chalice

English: This week we have completed the work on Where's My Teddy? By Jez Alborough.

Key vocabulary: Full stop, capital letter, finger spaces

Maths: This week in maths we have been recognising numbers up to 50. The children have been thinking of one more and less than a number up to 50 and sorting numbers in to groups of more and less than a given number up to 50.

Next week we will be counting in 2s and 5s.

Key vocabulary: numbers 1 to 50 (numerals and number words. Eg: 1, one, 2, two) order, bigger, greater, smaller, less than, more than, tens, ones
