<u>English</u>


This half term, we are studying the play 'Macbeth'. The children created a story mountain, including all of the main elements of the plot. We created our own heath scene by making the room dark and adding our own stormy sound effects. The children enjoyed creating the correct ambience for the scene when Macbeth and Banquo meet the three witches. The children will be using this to write a description of the heath as a director for their set designers.

<u>Maths</u>

In our Maths lessons this week, we have been continuing our work on decimals and fractions. The children have been learning about thousandths this week (the third number after the decimal point). They have been taught how to show a thousandth as a fraction, a decimal and on a place value grid. Please see the example below.



Key vocabulary: Decimal, decimal point, place value, fraction, equivalent, tenths, hundredths, thousandths

Get ahead: Next week we will be learning about ordering and comparing decimals.

Geography

The children have been coming to the end of their topic on rivers. They have looked at a range of paintings, photographs and maps of the Isle of Dogs based on a meander on the River Thames. They studied how the Isle of Dogs changed from 1747 to present day and the big part the river played in these changes with the introduction of the West India docks and then its closure in the 1980s.

The children will be moving on to study flooding in Bangladesh and use their findings to write an explanation text.

Key vocabulary: meander, Isle of dogs, satellite images, marsh, mud flats, creek, river, flood
