
#### Vocabulary

#### English

We have continued with our grammar revision this week and discussed with the children the importance of being secure with their knowledge of word classes (nouns, adjectives, adverbs, verbs, pronouns, determiners, conjunctions and prepositions) as these form the basis for many of the questions in the SATs test.

The children can continue to use the Grammar Monster website as a way of revising all the grammar topics they will be tested on in May.

We have also started a new writing topic based on a book called *'Night of the Gargoyles'* The children were able to use description to create a spooky atmosphere when writing from the perspective of the watchman.

#### Pre learning

We will be continuing with our revision of Grammar topics.

#### Mathematics

We continue with our word problems. With this being a very significant element to their maths work in secondary school, we want to keep some of the information provided in the last update in this week's one.

This week we have been looking at mathematical reasoning and problem solving. Children can find problem solving more challenging than arithmetic because of the number of steps required to solve puzzles and questions.

Problem solving requires 3 key skills:

- 1. Fluency. This is the ability to recall key facts and details. One example of mathematical fluency is having quick recall of times tables.
- 2. Reasoning. This is the ability to offer an idea, estimate, check, try a new approach to solving the problem.
- 3. Problem Solving. Problem solving uses the skills above to try and reach a solution. Problem solving invites us to think about different ways a solution might be reached. It encourages us to become increasingly independent mathematical learners.

#### Vocabulary

Estimate, guess, trial, improvement, checking, intervals, error.
