# Weekly Mission

### <u>English</u>

In English this week, the children have been looking more closely at the decision Macbeth and Lady Macbeth need to make about King Duncan. The children looked at the points for and against. Each child was given a role to play, either Macbeth or Lady Macbeth. They then took part in a whole class debate in role. After this, we looked at the features of writing a discussion text, such as modal verbs, relative clauses, adverbials and conjunctions. Next week, the children will write detailed discussion texts based on this.

### <u>Maths</u>

The week in Maths, we have continued learning about decimals to three decimal places – e.g.: 12.342. We looked in detail at comparing and ordering decimal numbers and how we can identify numbers that are greater than and less than or equal to a given number. Next week, we will begin relating percentages to our precvious learning about decimals and fractions.

Key vocabulary: Decimal, decimal point, place value, fraction, equivalent, tenths, hundredths, thousandths

#### <u>History</u>

The children have continued their learning about the Normans as part of their local history enquiry following on from their trip to Mountfitchet Castle. They have looked at the Bayeux Tapestry and how it tells the story of the Battle of Hastings. They learned that there is thought to be a missing piece of the tapestry and they attempted to draw what they thought it may have looked like in the style of the rest of the works. They will learn about Motte and Bailey castles and will design their own in groups.

Key Vocabulary: Normans, Mountfitchet, Bayeux Tapestry, Motte and Bailey, local, rediscovered.
