Weekly Mission



Sacred Heart Mission

Draw or paint an image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. You can then pray about what Jesus's Sacred Heart is like and write some words around your image to describe it. Finally, place your image in a special place so that you can pray with your image of the Sacred Heart all through the month of June.

Maths

This week we have continued our Shape topic by looking at calculating different angles. The children have looked at how they can use their angle knowledge to work out unknown angles around a point and on a straight line.

Vocabulary: obtuse, right, acute, reflex, straight, classify, estimate, protractor.

Get ahead: Look around your house, how much liquid do different containers hold?

English

This week the children took part in a group drama scene. This was the scene where Macbeth is taunted by Banquo's ghost. Different pupils had the opportunity to play the parts of Macbeth, Lady Macbeth, the assassins, Lennox, Banquo's ghost and the Lords. They then went on to pretend they were a reporter writing a 'gossip' article in the local magazine, using exaggerated language and relative clauses.

Vocabulary: Act, scene, Macbeth, Lady Macbeth, discussion, balanced argument, debate, modal verbs, relative clauses, adverbials, conjunctions, exaggeration

Get Ahead: Next week, we will be retelling the story of Macbeth in a sustained, narrative piece of writing. This week's comprehension homework will help the children to prepare for this.
