Year 3 Update 13.9.24

Dear Parents,

The children enjoyed starting forest school this week. Everyone took part in a Nature Scavenger Hunt. Children had to hunt and find specific leaves, seeds, and plants that Emma showed them and are common to our area. The intention for this is to reacquaint the children with the environment and to develop their ID skills. Lots of children had remembered the sycamore and hawthorn trees from last year! Then we played a quick game of Ostrich Tag which develops spatial awareness and peer cooperation. This week's session focused on the beautiful Oak tree and Emma shared a tale called 'The Giant Oak' which helps children to get to know the finer details of the Oak's trunk. The children joined in with actions and sound effects. For the rest of the session, children chose different activities including den building which involved problem solving and teamwork skills, digging, mud kitchen imaginative play, discovering 'Curiosity Corner' and making observations, 'Earth Friends' litter picking, and using the wet felting process with wool to make acorns. Some children were enjoying using the sweep nets to discover creatures and the longer grass was brilliant for this. Both classes were lucky to find large adult crickets! English: Writing to entertain based on the book Mini Rabbit Not Lost by John Bond.


- Throughout the week the children have written the introduction, introduced the problem and described the setting.


Key vocabulary in red.

Messages

- Forest School will continue every Monday for the remainder of this half term.

Children who are 'free readers' will be responsible for changing their own book, but this will be overseen by an adult. The children have been introduced to how to sign books in and out of the class library. Your child will only be able to change their book if an adult has written that it has been completed in their homework diary. It is important their daily reading is recorded in their homework diary.
- Homework will be set on Teams every Friday to be returned on the following Thursday.
- Children will be visiting Vicarage road stadium on Tuesday 17th September for a 'Healthy body, healthy mind' workshop. Please make sure you have paid using school gateway and returned the WFC paper consent form.
 Children have taken home their PE kits so they can wear these to school on Tuesday. Please make sure they wear joggers if it is cold.
- Homework has been set on Teams. Please check you can access the homework and let us know if there are any problems.
