Vocabulary: adjectives, metaphors, dialogue

Science

- This week the children learnt about cold-blooded vertebrates.
- They started to compile a fact-file about one animal from each of these three groups (fish, amphibian and reptile).

Vocabulary: cold-blooded, fish, amphibian, reptile, body temperature
