Below is a summary of what the children got up to during Forest School this week. Please ensure children are wearing appropriate clothing again on Monday.

### **Forest School**

The Year 4 classes were excited to be back in the 'forest' today! It was lovely to see them again and meet some new faces. We began with some exercises to regulate our nervous systems and release energy. We returned to our welcome routines including our chant and name game. The children listened carefully as Emma reminded the classes of our rules to keep everyone safe and how we care for nature during our sessions.

Next, Emma explained our intentions for Forest School this year. These included our new themes of 'Sustainability' and 'Cultivating Curiosity'. We will be looking at ways we can be 'Earth Friends' and each week there will be a 'Curiosity Corner' area to provide children with the opportunity to question, wonder, predict and discover more about the natural world.

Then everyone took part in a Nature Scavenger Hunt. Children had to hunt and find specific leaves and plants that Carrie showed them and are common to our area. The intention for this is to reacquaint the children with the environment and to develop their ID skills. Lots of children had remembered the tree names they had learnt last year!

After this we played a quick game of Ostrich Tag which develops spatial awareness and peer cooperation. Then Emma told the children a story called 'The Happiness Tree'. It is about a little child who breaks a spell that has made the world a miserable place with the help of a special creature (a glitter worm!). Together they bring happiness back to the world. The story is about the positive effect that nature and spending time in the outdoors can have on our happiness and well-being.

For the rest of the session, the children were busy with different activities including making their own glitter worms using pieces of elder wood, drills, and pipe cleaners. Other children chose to make happiness crowns out of willow by weaving pieces together. Some children used conkers, drills and small sticks to create weaving frames and spider webs. All these activities help to develop fine motor skills, hand-eye coordination, and focus. Other children worked together to build dens, 'Earth Friends' went on a litter pick, and some enjoyed digging and playing in the mud kitchen.

At the end of the session we discussed the curiosity of the day which was a fresh patch of stinging nettles. We finished by learning and singing a new song, 'When Winter Comes'. This is sung in three parts and the children sung it well in groups.
