RE

- This week we have looked at why we use Mass books.
- The children have created their own Mass books with key mass responses and hymns.
- Next week, we will be looking at our Catholic Social Teaching topic for this half term.

Vocabulary: Old Testament, New Testament, Gospel, Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, response, reverence.

<u>English</u>

- This week we have started our new fiction text 'Rapunzel'.
- We have listened to the traditional tale of Rapunzel and the modern version by Bethan Woolvin, thinking about the story sequence and characters.
- We will be looking at the four types of sentences exclamation, command, statement and question .

Vocabulary: traditional, modern, characters, sequence.

<u>Maths</u>

- This week we have begun our work on formal written methods,
- We have looked at using the column method for subtraction when subtracting two 2-digit numbers, including those who require exchanging.
- Please see this week's Teams homework for a clip of how we use this method.
- Next week, we will be consolidating our work on formal written methods and applying this to word problems.

Vocabulary: subtraction, total, addend, minuend, column, place value.

<u>Science</u>

- Over the last few weeks we have been testing a range of properties of materials.
- We have looked at bending, squashing, twisting and stretching materials such as elastic and play dough.

Vocabulary: material, property, bend, squash, twist, stretch.
