STORYTELLING WEEK




This newsletter's focus is prediction.

Prediction is using clues from the story or front cover to think about what could happen next.


- Based on the front cover, what do you think this story will be about?

Let's talk about stories.


In supporting your child's reading at home, it's important to reduce the stress there can be about reading and focusing on reading for pleasure. One of the ways of doing that is by having a chat with your child about their reading, often called 'Book Talk'. Talking to your child about the books that they share is a great way to develop both your child's language and understanding of what they read. Here is some advice to keep book talk engaging interesting and most importantly fun;


- Talking not testing; keep it open and explore the book together more of joint conversation about the book rather than answering questions.
- 'Tell me about' or 'I wonder' are great sentence starters for an open discussions.





