YEAR 2 BEGINS NEW CATHOLIC RE CURRICULUM

This week the Year 2 children will begin their work on the new RE Curriculum, *To Know You More Clearly.* This is the Catholic curriculum approved by the Bishops of England and Wales which Year 1 started working to in January and our Early Years children since April 2023.

CHAPLAINCY TEAM MEETING

- 1. **Prayer and Liturgy** around the school whereby children will be invited to lead prayer in their classrooms or other classes with the support of an adult. The team members brought Prayer and Liturgy planning sheets back to their classes to encourage their classmates to play a part.
- 2. **Jubilee Year of Hope roadmap.** Our Chaplaincy Team distributed prayer cards for hope to every child in the school. The team also gave each class a special roadmap which will guide us through the special jubilee activities for the coming year.

LEGROP

Luke 6:39-45

At that time: Jesus told his disciples a parable: 'Can a blind man lead a blind man? Will they not both fall into a pit? A disciple is not above his teacher, but everyone when he is fully trained will be like his teacher. Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye? How can you say to your brother, "Brother, let me take out the speck that is in your eye", when you yourself do not see the log that is in your own eye? You hypocrite! First take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take out the speck that is in your brother's eye.

'For no good tree bears bad fruit, nor again does a bad tree bear good fruit, for each tree is known by its own fruit. For figs are not gathered from thorn bushes, nor are grapes picked from a bramble bush. The good person out of the good treasure of his heart produces good, and the evil person out of his evil treasure produces evil, for out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks.'

As you slowly read or listen to the Gospel, which line stands out? Highlight it in the text. Pray about how God may be speaking to you through this line?
