PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

Sunday was the feast of the Presentation of the Lord and Fr. Tim shares some thoughts about it below:

FROM FR. TIM

"Candlemas" is the traditional name given to Sunday's feast because as early as the fifth century, the custom of celebrating this feast with lighted candles had developed. The lit candles symbolised Simeon's prophecy that Jesus would be "a light for revelation to the Gentiles."

This Feast has also been referred to as the "Feast of the Holy Encounter" because God, in the Person of Jesus, encountered Simeon and Anna in the Temple.

Forty days after Christmas, marks the day that Mary and Joseph would have presented Jesus in the Temple. Though Mary was pure and free from sin from the moment of her conception and Jesus, the only-begotten Son of God did not need to be redeemed, Mary and Joseph fulfilled these ritual obligations.

At the heart of this celebration is the encounter of Simeon and Anna with the Christ Child in the Temple. Remarkably, it is Simeon who was the first to proclaim Jesus as the Saviour of the World. He also prophesied that this salvation would be accomplished by a sword of sorrow that would pierce the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Anna, a prophetess, also came forward and "gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem". Therefore, these ritual acts were also a moment in which Jesus' divine mission was made manifest to the world.

As we celebrate Mary's ritual purification and Jesus' ritual redemption, we should see them as acts in which we are called to participate.

FROM HOLY ROOD SVP

During Lent, on March 14th, Paul's daughter Rebecca, a former pupil at St. Anthony's, will be visiting the school to speak to the children in her capacity as International Projects Manager for the SVP. We look forward to welcoming Rebecca back to St. Anthony's so that she can offer the children an insight into some of the work of the SVP.

THE WORK OF THE SVP

At the School Chaplaincy/Mini Vinnies mass and carol service last December, Fr. Tim used his homily to speak about the work of the SVP and Mini Vinnies:

Mission and charity are the driving force of the SVP and Mini Vinnies as it was the founder, St Vincent De Paul's charism. No matter what was on St Vincent's mind or whatever topic he was discussing, the theme of "the spirit" cropped up constantly in his teaching and in the experiences, he shared, witnessing to his spiritual and apostolic life.

St Vincent was absolutely convinced that nothing worthwhile could be achieved if one did not possess this missionary spirit. In this, he was one mind with Saint Paul, who wrote, "if anyone does not have the spirit of Christ, he does not belong to Christ" (Rome 8:9)

This conviction is shared by those in the SVP today. They carry on the good work of their founder throughout the world and I am yet, in my experience, not to find a SVP group in the parish and you dear Mini Vinnies share in that mission following in the spirit of St Vincent De Paul to preach the gospel by your acts of love and concern for the poor and vulnerable in our societies.

No matter how small or big your acts are, do them always with great love, to coin the phrase of St Teresa of Calcutta.



When we look closely at the words and the life of St Vincent, we will see that he emptied himself and clothed himself in humility following his greatest love, Jesus Christ.

Jesus, who continues to be close to those in need through his body, the church and his members like the SVP. May God bless all your efforts and may you one day join St Vincent in glorifying God in Heaven. Amen


CONNECT / KEEP LEARNING

COSPEL

Luke 2:22-32

When the time came for their purification according to the Law of Moses, the parents of Jesus brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord (as it is written in the Law of the Lord, 'Every male who first opens the womb shall be called holy to the Lord') and to offer a sacrifice according to what is said in the Law of the Lord, 'a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons'

doves, or two young pigeons'.

Now there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon, and this man was righteous and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ. And he came in the Spirit into the Temple, and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him according to the custom of the Law, he took him up in his arms and blessed God and said,

'Lord, now you are letting your servant depart in peace,

according to your word;

for my eyes have seen your salvation that you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel.'

As you slowly read or listen to the Gospel, which line stands out? Highlight it in the text. Pray about how God may be speaking to you through this line?
