Reflection for Mothers' Day *Reflection on the Fourth Station: Jesus meets His Blessed Mother. *

It is fitting, with Mothering Sunday just past, to reflect on this Station of the Cross: Jesus meets His blessed Mother.

I am reminded of that episode in the St Matthew's Gospel where his Mother and brothers were stood outside asking to speak to him. Jesus replies: "Who is mother and who are my brothers?"

Jesus adds: "Whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother. Now Jesus wasn't having a senior moment here but points to the preeminence of that command: Do the will of my Father".

Jesus does that perfectly by accepting death; even death on the Cross! Indeed, it follows that Jesus continues to meet His mother through the witness and lives of His members whenever we do the will of the Father. Ultimately, this means accepting our crosses and bearing them joyfully; uniting it to the ultimate sacrifice of Christ. As we know well, there would be no Easter without Good Friday and so there is no eternal happiness with God without suffering.

As Lent continues let us keep this in mind as we meditate on Christ's sacrifice and walk with him through the medium of the Stations of the Cross.

Let us too pray in thanksgiving for all our mothers and grandmothers who undeniably sacrificed much for us their children and grandchildren, leaving us an example for us to imitate.




BE ACTIVE

Jesus told them this parable: 'There was a man who had two sons. And the younger of them said to his father, "Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me." And he divided his property between them. Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took a journey into a far country, and there he squandered his property in reckless living. And when he had spent everything, a severe famine arose in that country, and he began to be in need. So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed pigs. And he was longing to be fed with the pods that the pigs ate, and no one gave him anything.

Luke 15:11-24

'But when he came to himself, he said, "How many of my father's hired servants have more than enough bread, but I perish here with hunger! I will arise and go to my father, and I will say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son. Treat me as one of your hired servants.'"

'And he arose and came to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion, and ran and embraced him and kissed him. And the son said to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son." But the father said to his servants, "Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet. And bring the fattened calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate. For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found." And they began to celebrate. Imagine you are the father in the parable. Write a note to the son, asking him to come home.

Your Mark 10 Mission is to pray the Examen prayer at the end of your day. Begin by asking the Holy Spirit to help you look back through your day. Where were you moving towards God with your kind actions and choices? Thank God for his help in those moments. Then look honestly at any times when you moved away from God in things you did or said. Make a simple prayer saying sorry and ask God to help you make a better decision next time. Finally enjoy the best part of prayer, being wrapped in God's love.
