FROM FR. TIM

In the week when Cardinals will select the new pope, Fr. Tim has written about how this process takes place.

Today, Cardinals will meet in a papal conclave to select the 267th Pope. The Pope is also the Bishop of Rome and the successor to the Apostle Saint Peter.

A papal conclave is a meeting of the College of Cardinals whose responsibility it is to elect a new pope. During the conclave the cardinals are not allowed to communicate with the outside world. They stay in a two-room suite in the Vatican.


The conclave is through one door only, locked from outside by the Marshal of the Conclave and from within by the cardinal camerlengo.

All cardinals, and they alone, have the right to vote in the conclave; they must, however, be legitimately appointed, have the use of reason, and be present in person, not through a procurator or by letter.



The cardinals take an oath that the proceedings of the conclave will remain secret. After each vote during the conclave, smoke from the Vatican signals whether someone has been elected. Black smoke means no one was elected, and white smoke means we have a new pope.




BE ACTIVE / KEEP LEARNING
