RE:

- In RE this week the children have been writing a letter to Pope Leo to explain how they are going to be good stewards (look after God's creations).
- Key Vocabulary: steward, creation, Laudati Si

English:

- This week the children have started their new topic on poetry.
- The children have been reading the poems, 'Words are Ours' by Michael Rosen and 'The Magic Box' by Kit Wright. The children had to write the similarities and differences between the tow poems.
- The children have started to plan their own poem all about Autumn, by using all five senses.
- Key vocabulary: free verse, simile, rhyme, alliteration, poetry, poet

Coming up next week: to use their plans to write their own poem, using the poetic devise learnt.

Maths

- This week children have continued with measuring.
- The children have been using weighing scales to measure items found in the classroom.

Key Vocabulary: kilograms, grams, approximately, estimate, heavy, light, intervals, weighing scale

Science

- To explore how knowledge has progressed over time and how different jobs use information.

Key Vocabulary: nutritionist, balanced diet, carbohydrate, protein, energy, vitamins, fibre, digestion Coming up next week: topic assessment
