Key vocabulary: praise, thanks, creation

Coming up next week: to write a letter to Pope Leo explaining how you are going to be good stewards of Creation, inspired by Pope Francis letter.

English:

Writing to entertain based on the book Mini Rabbit Not Lost by John Bond.

- Learnt about different story structures
- Changing verbs from present to past tense
- Planned and began writing their own stories

Key vocabulary: past tense, present tense, irregular verbs.

Coming up next week: editing and improving own stories and publishing final piece.

Maths

- Children have continued to learn about rounding 2- and 3-digit numbers to the nearest 10 and rounding to the nearest 100.
- The children have been comparing lengths. Where they have been converting centimetres to millimetres and metres to centimetres.

Key Vocabulary: digit, rounding, nearest 10, nearest 100, centimetres, metres, millimetres, length, measurements, convert

Coming up next week: the children will be learning to read a scale using Grams and Kilograms.

Science

- Identified the main nutrient groups and their functions.

Key Vocabulary: balanced diet, carbohydrate, carnivore, herbivore, omnivore, energy, nutrient, minerals, fats, fibre, vitamins, protein.

Coming up next week: To explain why food is important for energy and look at the different food groups.
