Religious Education

- This week in RE we have continued with our Creation and Covenant topic where we have been looking at the second creation story in Genesis and how this was interpreted by John in his Gospel.
- The children have been making parallels between scripture and their own lives.

Vocabulary: temptation, gratitude, right and wrong

Pre-learning

- We will continue with this topic next week.

Mathematics

- This week the children consolidated their work on multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1,00.
- They also completed an end of topic assessment.
- The children then moved on to looking at a range of different mental methods e.g. doubling and halving, using known facts.

Vocabulary: place value columns, multiplying, dividing, metres, kilometres, grams, kilograms, millilitres, litres

Pre-learning

- We will continue with this next week.

English

- As part of National Poetry Week the class took part in an online poetry workshop with Tom AKA Tomfoolery.
- This session was on the theme of Remembrance and Tom gave us some great tips to generate ideas when writing poems.
- We will be putting these ideas into practice in preparation for Remembrance Day.

Vocabulary: stimulus, ideas, planning, rhyming structure

Pre-learning:

- We will be continuing with our Night of the Gargoyles work next week.

Homework

- There is maths (revision of multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1,000) and spelling homework this week.
- Children need to complete the maths homework on the squared paper and write their sum or working out and not just the answer.
- The spelling homework can be completed on the sheet
- Due in on Friday 10th October
