FROM FR.TIM

With our new RE topic in mind, Fr. Tim's reflection this week is about the prophets.

In the Old Testament we are presented with many prophets such as Moses, Elijah, Jeremiah & Isaiah. Their role and mission is simple: relay what God has told them in order to prepare those being addressed with what is to come.

Prophets are always sent by God, sometimes it is to warn people or bring them back to the right path if they have strayed, other times, it is to encourage people not to lose hope in God despite whatever seemingly hopeless situation they may find themselves in.

Ultimately, the role and purpose of the prophet is to lead people to God.

The greatest prophet in the Bible as Jesus Himself says was John the Baptist. His role was to prepare the way of the Lord. It was John the Baptist who said: Behold the Lamb of God. Words that are used at every Mass.

All the events of the Old Testament lead up to the birth of Christ; the Incarnation of God. For the first time in history God has taken flesh and dwelt among us. He doesn't remain hidden in the heavens but comes down to earth to show us the way to heaven which is uniquely only through Him.

JOHN 2:13-22

The Passover of the Jews was at hand, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. In the Temple he found those who were selling oxen and sheep and pigeons, and the money-changers sitting there. And making a whip of cords, he drove them all out of the Temple, with the sheep and oxen. And he poured out the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables. And he told those who sold the pigeons, 'Take these things away; do not make my Father's house a house of trade.' His disciples remembered that it was written, 'Zeal for your house will consume me.' So the Jews said to him, 'What sign do you show us for doing these things?' Jesus answered them, 'Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews then said, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this Temple, and will you raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking about the temple of his body. When therefore he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the Scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken.
