



Reception Poppies w/c 3rd November-Owl Babies


Drawing Club





















Maths

This week in maths we have been learning about how to 'subitise' numbers to 5. subitise means to recognise the number of objects in a small group without counting them. The children have been looking at dice patterns, groups of objects and using number frames to support their number recognition. They have done brilliantly playing games with each other and supporting others with counting.

Thank you to all those parents who attended the phonics meeting after school on Wednesday. If you were unable to attend I have sent home the handouts that were available in the children's book bags today.



This week we have learnt the sounds:

- j 'down his body, curl and dot'
- v 'down a wing, up a wing'



- y 'down a horn, up a horn and under his head'
- We have also been practising blending sounds to make words.

The children have been practising oral blending and also using their 'Fred fingers' to pinch the sounds and then write a cvc word.

We have now learnt:



In PE, we played some turn taking games such as getting treasure from the pirate's treasure chest. We then did some balancing to work on our coordination skills.







Maths: Counting Objects to 10

Home Learning Challenges




Encourage your child to help you when out shopping by counting and collecting objects to put into the basket, e.g. 'Can you get 2 apples?'

Support your child to help make simple recipes by counting amounts, e.g. 'Can you put 2 spoons of cocoa into the bowl?'

When playing with building bricks or small toys, encourage your child to count how many of each colour or size.




Read number-themed books and count sets of pictures, e.g. Goldilocks and the Three Bears – count the bears, bowls,




Play simple board games and encourage your child to count the spots shown on the dice and the number of spaces to move.



Sing number-themed counting rhymes and use your fingers or small props to help count the items, e.g. 10 Green Bottles.
