



## Reception Poppies w/c 22nd September-We're Going on a Bear Hunt










This is optional homework, the children can practise counting the Bear Hunt characters and writing the correct number. Please encourage them to form the numbers correctly.

Today is National Teaching Assistants' Day.


This is an opportunity for us to recognise the invaluable role our TAs play in children's lives up and down the country.
