## RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

This half term in RE, our topic is Galilee to Jerusalem. The children are learning about the life of Jesus as he travels, teaches and heals, helping people to know how much God loves them. They will hear some of Jesus' parables and miracles and discover what they show us about God's Kingdom of love, fairness and forgiveness. As they learn, the children will also be thinking about how they can be disciples today by being kind, including others and trying to make loving choices at school and at home.

## PRAYER LIFE

### Focus for Prayer Around the School

Our Early Years children will be introduced to simple water symbolism; sign of the cross; Jesus' baptism picture story; "Thank you God that you love me."

Years 1 and 2 will hear Story of Jesus' baptism; talk about belonging to God's family; class liturgy using water, candle and white cloth; practise Sign of the Cross and simple responses.

Years 3 to 6: Celebration of the Word on Baptism of the Lord; renewal of baptismal promises in child-friendly language; prayers for deeper discipleship and new beginnings; introduction or revision of responses from the Directory.



## GOSPEL

JOHN 1:29-34

At that time: John saw Jesus coming towards him, and said, 'Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, "After me comes a man who ranks before me, because he was before me." I myself did not know him, but for this purpose I came baptising with water, that he might be revealed to Israel.' And John bore witness: 'I saw the Spirit descend from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but he who sent me to baptise with water said to me, "He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain, this is he who baptises with the Holy Spirit." And I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God.'
