RE

- In RE this week the children have been writing their own Lenten promise.

Key vocabulary: Lent, miracle

Coming up next week: The last Supper story.

English

- In English, the children continued to write their own persuasive speech, based on how we can look after the environment.
- To include facts, rhetorical questions and alliteration.

Key vocabulary: persuasive, rhetorical question, facts, information, conclusion, compose

Coming up next week: the children will begin a new topic on personal narratives.

Maths

- To make links between bar charts and pictograms.
- To complete a pictogram from information provided.
- To interpret and infer information from pictograms.

Key vocabulary: pictogram, bar chart, data, information row, column, table, interpret

Coming up next week: multiplication and division word problems.

Science

- To explain the role of light sources.
- To plan and draw a results table.

Key Vocabulary: light source, luminous, record, protect

Coming up next week: To compare light reflecting on different surfaces
