### RE

- In RE this week the children have been learning about St Pauls letter to the Corinthians.
- To know that the Church teaches that there is only one God. We call this mystery the Trinity.
- The children created a poster based on what they have learnt about the Holy Trinity.

**Key vocabulary:** Holy Trinity, Corinthians, St Paul, Bible, New Testament

### English

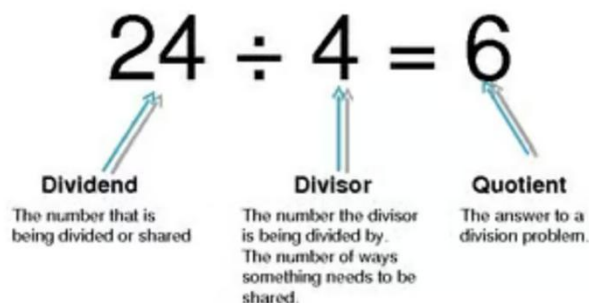
- This week we started our new writing topic, 'instructions'.
- The children had to construct command sentences using the present tense.
- To accurately use prepositions when writing commands.
- To plan a journey for a reader to follow the instructions to complete.

**Key vocabulary:** instruction, command, preposition, verb, present tense, imperative verb

Coming up next week: The children will be writing their own set of instructions.

### Maths

- The children have been solving division problems by using bar models.
- To halve 2- and 3-digit numbers by sharing into 2 equal groups.



**Key vocabulary:** quotient, halve, equal, bar model

**dividend, divisor,**

Coming up next week: Sharing 2 and 3- digit numbers by ones with regrouping.

### Science

- The children continued to write up about the life cycle of a plant.
- Begun to explore how plants adapt, we will continue on with this next week.

Key vocabulary: seed stage, germination, seedling, leaf growing stage, flowering stage, pollination, life cycle

Coming up next week: To complete a post topic assessment.

For this week's homework, the children have been set a task on MyMaths based on using the column multiplication. This needs to be completed by next Thursday.
